- Talk to your employer about emergency plans for the building where you work. Think about other places that you and family members regularly spend time, like your child's school. Give emergency kits to people who count on you (college students, elderly parents, etc.).
- Put together basic emergency kits for people who may not be able to do so for themselves or for those who may not think of doing it for themselves. Know how others in your community will respond in a disaster.
- Talk to other people when you are developing an emergency plan for a school, workplace or organization.
